Lastly, please welcome Wendy McGee (formerly Bramhall) as our new *Soundboard Editor*. Thank you, Moya Nordlund, for doing an excellent job during the last year. We also extend a welcome to Susan Hoop as *Public Relations Chair*. Thank you to Susan Bishop for serving in this post for the last six years, and opening the door for us to communicate through Facebook. Please friend Susan Hoop and Alabama Music Teachers Association on Facebook, and share the activities of your studio as well as items of interest to our association.

On Saturday, she worked with the college winners in a positive and helpful master class. She, too, was very complimentary of our state's talent and quality of teaching.

Not only did we have wonderful guests at our conference, but also wonderful members involved. Kevin Chance, who grew up in our program, is now teaching us how to become better teachers. He did a workshop on teaching technique to students, and was very well received. 


#### Dear Colleagues:




#### **Foothills Piano Festival**

#### **Master Classes**

MTNA will present two Advanced Piano master classes at the 2014 MTNA National Conference. John Perry, NCTM, will present a master class on Sunday, March 23. Perry is professor at the Glenn Gould School of the Royal Conservatory of Music in Toronto, professor of piano at California State University Northridge in Los Angeles, visiting artist faculty at Boston University, Professor Emeritus of the USC Thornton School of Music and is artistic director at Southern California Music Institute in Los Angeles, which he founded. Spencer Myer will present a master class on Tuesday, March 25. Myer is an acclaimed pianist who won first prize in the 10th UNISA International Piano Competition in South Africa and also was Gold Medalist of the 2008 New Orleans International Piano Competition. He has performed in recitals, orchestras and festivals throughout the world, and has served on the faculties of the Baldwin-Wallace College and Oberlin College conservatories of music.

#### **Events**

Byron Janis, one of the world's greatest pianists, will engage in a question and answer conversation session with attendees Monday, March 24. Janis has had a long, distinguished career. In this interview, Janis will share how he overcame the challenges of being a pianist with arthritis. He has played with every major symphony orchestra in the world and performed at the White House six times. Janis has been featured on television programs such as *The Tonight Show*, 20/20, CBS Sunday Morning and in the PBS documentary The Byron Janis Story. He composed the score for the musical "The Hunchback of Notre Dame." Janis's many honors include Commander of the French Legion d'Honneur for Arts and Letters, the Grand Prix du Disque, the Stanford Fellowship and the gold medal from the French Society for the Encouragement of Progress. His recordings appear on the RCA, Mercury Phillips and EMI labels, and he became a Yamaha artist in 2011.



#### **Evening Concerts**

The Manasse/Nakamatsu Duo, composed of clarinetist Jon Manasse and pianist Jon Nakamatsu, will perform in concert after the Opening Session, on Saturday, March 22. The duo serves as co-directors of the Cape Cod Chamber Music Festival. They have made appearances on some of the country's most prestigious series and have released two CDs. Individually, Manasse and Nakamatsu have developed extensive repertoires and discographies. Manasse has served as the principal clarinetist of The Metropolitan Opera Orchestra. Nakamatsu is the Gold Medalist of the 10th Van Cliburn International Piano Competition.

Spencer Myer, one of the outstanding pianists of his generation, will perform in recital Tuesday, March 25. Celebrated by critics and audiences alike, he has performed in recitals, orchestras and festivals throughout the world. Myer won first prize in the 10th UNISA International Piano Competition in South Africa and also was Gold Medalist of the 2008 New Orleans International Piano Competition. Other honors include the 2006 Christel DeHaan Classical Fellowship from the American Pianists Association and the Jacob K. Javits Memorial Fellowship from the United States Department of Education. A graduate of the Juilliard School, he has served on the faculties of the Baldwin-Wallace College and Oberlin College conservatories of music and can be heard on the Dimension Records label.


