Our guest clinician for this year's conference is Gail Berenson, a dedicated teacher, performer, author, and noted expert on musician wellness issues who also have served as the former MTNA president and the Ohio University Professor Emerita of Piano. She will offer three sessions for us with the titles: (1) The Art of communication - Nurturing Resourceful and Spirited Students, (2) Strategies for Coping with Performance Anxiety, and (3) Healthy Practicing Strategies: An Injury-Preventive Prescription. AMTA will also host string quest clinicians, Drs. Laurel (viola) and Christin Pfeifer Yu (violin) from the Valdosta State University. They will offer a pedagogical session with the title "Finding the **Balance with Proper Chinrest and Shoulder Rest** Combinations."





We also have a voice clinician, Dr. Shellie Beeman from the Jacksonville State University. She will offer her session with the title, "Get your Voice Moving: Tips for a Healthy Day of Teaching." The string and voice guest clinicians will also offer a master class.



She is currently a student with Dr. Chance at Alabama.


