

McCain, Guest Artist Hailed by the New York Times as a "virtuoso pianist" McCain, has a built a formidable career as a performer, educator and speaker. As a recitalist, her credits include performances at Wigmore Hall and Barbican Centre in London, Weill Hall at Carnegie and Merkin Hall in New York City and more. Other highlights include guest appearances with the Dallas Symphony Orchestra, Memphis Symphony Orchestra and Fox Valley Symphony Orchestra. In 2022, she was the mistress of ceremony for the Van Cliburn International Piano Competition. Dedicated to promoting the



works of Black and other underrepresented composers, McCain curates Underrepresented Composers Concerts for multiple arts organizations. She is an American Prize winner for her solo piano recordings of these works and won a Gold Global Music Award for her recent album project Heritage. In 2021, Hal Leonard published her transcriptions of Twenty-Four Traditional African American Folk Songs.



Dennis Alexander, Guest ClinicianHis over 450 publications and recordings have earned him an international reputation as one of the world's most prolific and popular composers of educational piano music for students at all levels. Professor Alexander taught applied piano and piano pedagogy at the University of Montana, Missoula, California State Fullerton and California State Northridge. He currently lives in Albuquerque, NM where he maintains a studio of adult students and continues to present workshops for local, state, and national organizations. In August of 2015, he was awarded a "Lifetime Achievement Award" by the National Conference on Keyboard Pedagogy in recognition of his extraordinary service to the music teaching profession and in 2020 was awarded the prestigious MTNA/Frances Clark Pedagogy Award for

his two collections of "Nocturnes for Piano." Mr. Alexander was invited to conduct the intermediate master class at the MTNA National Conference in Reno, NV in 2023.

The UAH MTNA Collegiate Chapter attended the 2024 MTNA National Conference with the help of scholarships from AMTA. Below is the report they wrote about their experience.

With heartfelt gratitude to AMTA for the support of collegiate students, The University of Alabama in Huntsville (UAH) MTNA Collegiate Chapter recently traveled to Atlanta for the first time to the MTNA National Conference since the pandemic. The chapter's travel was made possible in part through funding from AMTA. We greatly appreciate the scholarship funding and the opportunity for college students to experience a professional conference. Attending the MTNA National Conference has been greatly beneficial for the student chapter, both in the collegiate studies and as an opportunity for professional development. Three members from the UAH chapter attended: William Owens, a recent graduate from UAH's Piano Pedagogy program, JD Rich, a rising senior majoring in music technology and computer science, and chapter president Kathryn Hardgrave, majoring in piano performance and music Technology.

The chapter arrived in Atlanta on Saturday morning, and attended the pre-conference Pedagogy Saturday. There were five different presentation tracks to explore, covering topics from recreational music making and musician wellness to entrepreneurial tips for building and maintaining a private music studio. Creative Conditioning for the Rookie Composer presentation by Leila Viss was one of the many wonderful sessions that the chapter attended. Viss shared how creative approaches to teaching, such as using rhythm cups and the Mission Impossible theme, can unlock new levels of engagement and understanding for students. She also discussed methods of learning composition for students and professionals. Viss holds frequent "Composiums", Zoom meetings for teaching professionals to compose together and provide community support for each other's creative projects.

Along with informative presentations, the conference program featured several recitals, both by visiting artists and MTNA competition winners. A recital by soprano Sonya Headlam and pianist Martin Neron opened the conference on Saturday night, featuring a diverse array of

works by composers spanning several centuries. Chapter members also attended a concert by the MTNA Distinguished Composer of the Year, Robert McClure, with a performance of his Celestial Miniatures.




