

Richard Cionco

Pianist **Richard Cionco** -- praised by Donal Henahan of the New York Times for his "sensitive pianism" has performed as soloist with orchestras, as chamber musician, and as a recitalist on three continents.

A Steinway Artist, Mr. Cionco is a graduate of the University of Maryland and The Juilliard School. Important chamber music performances include those at Alice Tully Hall at Lincoln Center, the Festival of New American Music in Sacramento, and at the Orfeo Music Festival in Italy.

He has performed in recital in nearly every major U.S. city and his performances of Liszt's complete *12 Transcendental Etudes* have brought him rave reviews. Recently, he performed at New Mexico State University, the University of New Mexico, Kent State University, Florida State University, University of Alberta in Canada, Stetson University, Pensacola State University,

the University of Florida, San Jose State University, the Chicago College of Performing Arts, the Great Music in Scarborough Series in New York, the University of Nevada Las Vegas, University of Nevada Reno, Tulane University in New Orleans, in Anchorage, AK, and dozens more.

Mr. Cionco has recorded solo and chamber music by Daniel Kingman for *Innova Records* and his first solo CD, *Latin American Music for Solo Piano*, on the Centaur Records label has received rave reviews, notably by the American Record Guide. Each summer he serves on the artist faculty of the Orfeo International Music Festival and Competition in Northern Italy and performs at the Samsø Piano Festival in Denmark. He has given master classes, lectures, recitals and has served as adjudicator in China and Hong Kong. In 2012, he released a solo CD of Beethoven's late piano music, and a CD of music by American composer, Sunny Knable —both on the Centaur label.

Mr. Cionco was a Teaching Fellow for David Dubal at The Juilliard School for four years and is presently Professor of Piano at California State University, Sacramento where he teaches, performs, and composes. He also enjoys running competitively and cooking, as well as hiking far and wide.

Fred Karpoff

Dr. Fred Karpoff has performed as soloist and collaborative pianist on four continents, including venues in Germany, France, Luxembourg, Belgium, Ghana, Zimbabwe, Ireland, Finland, Italy, China, and the U.S. A former Artistic Ambassador for the U.S. Information Agency, Fred is a prize winner in the San Antonio, Dublin and Competition Internationale piano competitions. As a guest artist at music festivals in the U.S. and Europe, he has collaborated with many of America's foremost musicians.



Fred presents workshops and master classes throughout North America, including appearances at MTNA and recently with Randall Faber at the National Conference on Keyboard Pedagogy conference (NCKP). He is the artistic producer of *Entrada Piano Technique*, an online video resource for teachers

and students to achieve effortless piano technique. Entrada has partnered with the Faber Piano Institute to produce *Technique & Artistry Online*, a professional development resource for teachers and pianists. More information is available at faberpiano.com.

Fred has studied with Leon Fleisher, Ann Schein, Robert Weirich, and Yoheved Kaplisnsky, with extensive coaching by Karl Ulrich Schnabel and Richard Goode. He holds a DMA from the Peabody Conservatory and an undergraduate degree from Northwestern University.

He is Professor of Piano at the Setnor School of Music at Syracuse Universtiy and has served as Visiting Professor at the Eastman School of Music. He is a Steinway Artist and Director of Professional Development at the Faber Piano Institute.

Elena is from Ulyanovsk, Russia and studied music at the N. G. Zhiganov Kazan State Conservatory in Kazan, Russia.

Our annual Ritz Recital was held at the Ritz Theater in Sheffield, Alabama in early November. This event is for our advancing young pianists and gives them a true performance opportunity on stage with a grand piano. It was a memorable Sunday afternoon with thirty-eight students performing.

We celebrated the holidays in December at the Holly and Ivy luncheon at the Kennedy-Douglass Center for the Arts in Florence. We enjoyed ending the year with beautiful music, wonderful food, and fellowship.

Dr. Tim O'Steen began our January meeting with a superb performance of Rachmaninov Prelude in D Major, Op. 23, No. 4. Even though the Baldwin County Music Teachers Association is small in number, we do not lack for activities for our students.

The Fall Recital was held on Saturday, October 21, 2018 at the Eastern Shore Presbyterian Church in Fairhope. So many students were involved that two recitals were planned to accommodate them all.

The future of church music ministers is more promising after the BCMTA hosted a Hymn Festival on Monday, November 6 at First Baptist Church in Fairhope. Adults and children played one hymn and another selection plus a scale for an adjudicator and received comments on their performance. Many students enjoy this event each fall.

Steinway Piano Gallery of Spanish Fort secured the Harvey Lavan Cliburn piano in November. For the past two and a half months, his spectacular nine foot historic instrument has been available to the pianists in south Alabama and western Florida. Many events were planned to provide opportunities to play and perform on this special instrument. Some of the teachers of BCMTA performed a recital using this instrument. It truly was a unique experience to play the same keys that the famous Cliburn played. One can even see where his hands rubbed some of the finish off the cabinet as he stood to bow. The Steinway Gallery also showed the video of Cliburn's early years and the significance of winning the Tchaikovsky International Piano Competition in 1958.



The last weekend of January was especially busy for BCMTA. <u>Musicpalooza</u> is our mid-year music camp held in Robertsdale on Saturday, January 27. All school-aged students could participate in this event which presents music games, ear training, composition, history, theory, note reading, and master classes. Our clinician for the Master Class this year was Dr. Robert Holm, Chair of the Keyboard division at the University of South Alabama. Teachers prepared a variety of sessions appropriate for the age and skill level of the students. This year's focus was on 20th century music. The four age groups were named Copland, Bernstein, Gershwin and Stravinsky. The closing ceremony was a performance by Dr. Holm and a short excerpt of the ballet THE FIREBIRD by Igor Stravinsky danced and choreographed by Abby Kiernan, a 12th grade piano student involved in the music camp. All students received a ribbon for participating.



On Sunday, January 28, we held the Adult Musicale. Any adult studying privately with a BCMTA teacher is encouraged to perform for other adults without the intimidation of hearing younger students play. Because the Van Cliburn piano was still at the Steinway Piano Gallery, our adults had the opportunity to perform on this outstanding instrument. Harp, cello, and piano players participated.



We have had a busy and productive year so far and there are many more events planned. February 17 is our Boys Recital which is exclusively reserved for boys only. District Auditions are on April 7 in Mobile and each BCMTA studio is planning a spring recital. Our students never lack for an event in which to be involved.



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
