

#### MTNA PERFORMANCE COMPETITION

November 2-3 is the date of this year's Alabama MTNA Competition at Birmingham-Southern College. This is a live competition.

These are our numbers for this year:1 Senior Piano Duet (representative); 1 Senior String (representative); 1 Young Artist Brass (representative); 2 Junior Strings; 4 Junior Piano; 2 Senior Voice; 15 Senior Piano; 5 Young Artist Woodwind; 2 Young Artist Voice; 5 Young Artist Piano; and 2 Young Artist Chamber Music Woodwind.

Our judges are Dr. Boris Abramov (Columbus State), string; Dr. Tyler Nelson (Vanderbilt University), voice; Dr. Joseph Girard (Columbus State), woodwinds; and Dr. Arunesh Nadgir (Middle Tennessee State), Dr. Esther Park (Eastern Tennessee State), and Karen Ann Krieger (Vanderbilt University), piano.

The winner or representative of each group will send a video of their performance to the Southern Division. This is the first year MTNA is doing this, and hopefully it will make things easier for the performers and the division chairs.

Originally from southern California, Jovanni graduated from the Los Angeles County High School for the Arts and went on to receive performance degrees at the Vienna Conservatory of Music and Trinity College of Music in London, and a D.M.A. in Piano Pedagogy and Performance from the University of Michigan.

Coming from a family of musicians whose musical heritage dates back more than a century, Jovanni has appeared to public acclaim on five continents, including London's St. Martin-in-the-Fields, Weill Recital Hall at Carnegie Hall, the Eroica-Saal in Vienna, and the Irish World Academy of Music and Dance.

The combination of artistry and professional development is central to Jovanni's philosophy of teaching. He strives to develop artist-teachers who are adaptable, analytical, and reflective, while preparing his students for a career in the arts by creating professional opportunities for them.

Jovanni is dedicated to the future of the teaching profession, especially in advocating for young professionals. He received national recognition for spearheading the formation of the Piano Pedagogy Symposium, a conference *by* college students *for* college students. Following his service as a member of the 2018 MTNA National Conference Committee, he was appointed to chair the MTNA Select Committee on Young Professionals. He currently advises Samford University's MTNA Collegiate Chapter and serves on both the Young Professionals and National Program Committees for the National Conference on Keyboard Pedagogy (NCKP).

In addition to emphasizing performance, pedagogy, and entrepreneurship, Jovanni believes there are countless ways to change the world through music. His philanthropic efforts have helped raise over \$100,000 through benefit concerts for organizations like the *Alay Sa Kabataan* (Gift of the Children) Foundation in the Philippines and Grace House Mississippi.

Jovanni will be the featured artist on Samford's Davis Architect Series recital on Friday, November 9 in a program that will include works by Haydn, Rachmaninoff, and Friedrich Gulda.
