has been an immense sense of joy to get to enjoy such outstanding student performances.





This work is remarkable every year, but is even more so this year as so many difficulties had to be overcome for successful teaching and music making to continue.

The virtual conference featured four thought-provoking presentations on a variety of subjects. Dr. Beth McGinnis of Samford University gave an informational presentation on her podcast and website, Hear in Alabama, which focuses on the rich legacy of music in our state. A pedagogical presentation with many useful tips and tricks was given by Sheryl Lott on intermediate piano practice strategies titled, "Thinking and Playing: Practice Better, Learn Faster, Perform More Effectively." Yangmingting Fang gave a tremendously well-researched presentation, "Understanding and Coping with Performance Anxiety." A strings presentation was given by Juan Sebastian Lopez on vibrato exercises for violinists, "Vibrato: Initiation, Intermediate, and Advanced."

Our virtual members' recital offered an exciting range of solo repertoire and ensembles. Three live Zoom Shop Talks gave teachers the chance to swap ideas for advanced, intermediate, and beginning students. A TOY Talk with past recipients of the AMTA Teacher of the Year award explored what AMTA has meant to the careers of some of our most successful and involved members. Thank you to all of the teachers who attended these talks!

Though we were virtual once again this year, the traditions of community and shared knowledge were still present and will certainly return full force for the 70th Annual AMTA Conference in 2022. Hope to see you all there!

I hope many of your students will enter the MTNA Performance Competition. Our competition is to be an online audition. The information you need is all on the MTNA.org website under competitions. Please register for the Alabama MTNA Performance Competition online by Wednesday, September 15, 2021 at 3:00 P.M. Eastern Time. At that time, you must submit your repertoire list, and it cannot be changed after that. This information will be available to me immediately. I will contact you with further information about submitting an online performance. The performance will be submitted via YouTube. Each piece may be performed separately, but you must title each performance and submit all the performances in one email, sent to

AlabamaMTNAPerformanceComp@gmail.com no later than October 29, 2021 at 4:00 central time. Please title your email with your name, category (Junior, Senior, or Young Artist) and instrument (voice, piano, string, wind). If it is received, I will email you back. If you have not heard from me in 24 hours, please resubmit.

PLEASE submit before the deadline in case there is a problem. I will send all of this again to students who have entered through the MTNA website. After all submissions have been received, I will send them to the judges. The results will be tallied by November 10, and all who enter will be notified of the results by November 15.

Dr. Manley Blackwell

President of West Alabama Music Teachers Association

Dr. Manley Blackwell, pianist, is Emeritus Professor of Music at the University of West Alabama. At UWA he taught studio piano and academic courses in Music Theory, Music History, and Introduction to Music from 1992 until his retirement in 2018. Since retirement, he teaches privately in his home and accompanies academic recitals for music majors at the University of Alabama. He is also an accomplished organist and plays weekly for St. Leo's Catholic Church in Demopolis and St. Francis of Assisi Catholic Church in Livingston.

His degrees include the Bachelor and Master of Music Degrees in Piano Performance from Louisiana State University and the Doctor of Musical Arts Degree from Michigan State University. 
