
Congratulations and thank you to everyone who attended and participated in



AMTA Handbook Changes

Dear Colleagues,

The following update for the AMTA Handbook was announced at the AMTA Conference at JSU! It was great to see several of you there, and the changes were well received. Since this impacts most of our members, I wanted to send this as well by email since the changes will be effective with our next district audition cycle in Spring 2024. Please pay particular attention to the changes made to the Gold and Silver levels for Division II and III. Many thanks to Susan Hoop and Ron Shinn with their help carefully reviewing the syllabus and helping brainstorm for effective updates. We developed what we feel is more sound sequencing of keys for Division 1, and we tried to eliminate to the best of our ability large jumps that were perceived in the old syllabus in Division 1. A big change that was made in this regard is that ages 7 and 8 are NO LONGER COMBINED. Age 7 does not yet have to prepare the cadence, and there are fewer new keys than they had when we combined ages 7-8. We also felt that it would be a huge benefit to the students and give more credence to the Gold Level auditions to require more arpeggios in Divisions 2 and 3. Now, the students will be learning all of their scales and all of their standard arpeggios by their senior year. We have an accommodation for the silver level such that those students can play cross-hand arpeggios in lieu of the standard arpeggios. For the Gold Level, you will note that we are not trying to trick the students with the required keys as we are largely introducing new keys that share the same fingering premise together.

This summer, we are going to work on updating the theory forms on the AMTA website, and we are hoping to develop several YouTube videos for teachers, parents, and students of mock auditions for each division. We hope this will help those new to the auditions understand what to expect in the audition room. We will update as these projects are completed. I am also happy to present judge workshops on the new handbook for local associations as well.

Thanks so much for your support of our auditions, and if you have questions, do not hesitate to ask!

2024 AMTA HANDBOOK SUMMARY OF CHANGES

For ages 6-12, judges will ask for RH **OR** LH for the chords. This will be reflected on the theory sheet. Students must prepare each hand, but only one hand will be demonstrated for each key. They also should be aware of playing with the correct hand.

No changes have been made to the chords, cadences, and intervals beyond some minor sequencing adjustments.

Division I

The most substantial changes are in Division 1 where we have sequenced the keys into a pedagogically sound order that emphasizes fingering patterns over key signatures.

Age 6: Required keys are now C, G, and D Major. F Major is removed.

Age 7 and Age 8 are no longer combined.

- Age 7: Required keys are now C, G, D Major and A Minor.
 NO CADENCE REQUIRED. All other requirements remain the same.
- Age 8: Required keys: C, G, D Major; A, E, D Minor. Add Cadence.
- Age 9: Required keys: C, G, D, A, E Major; A, E, D Minor.
- Age 10: Required keys: C, G, D, A, E, F Major; C, G, F, D, A, E Minor **Two-octave scales are no longer required at age 10.** Chords and inversions are still required.
- Age 11: Required keys: C, G, D, A, E, B, F Major; C, G, F, D, A, E, B Minor Two-octave scales are required.

Divisions II and III

The required keys for scales, chords, cadences, and intervals remain unchanged. The only scale change is that age 16 is now required to play 4 octaves instead of 3 octaves. 3 octave scales have been eliminated.

However, substantial changes have been made for **ARPEGGIOS**. For students playing at the **GOLD LEVEL**, the following **standard arpeggio** keys should be prepared. Note that the keys are introduced by fingering groups. Students playing at the **SILVER LEVEL** should prepare the same keys, but they may play **cross-hand arpeggios**.

Arpeggios by age:

- 12: C, G, F Major; C, G, F Minor
- 13: C, G, F Major; C, G, F, D, A, E, B Minor
- 14: C, G, F, D, A, E, B Major; C, G, F, D, A, E, B Minor
- 15: All white key majors and minors; C# and F# Major; C# and F# Minor
- 16: All white key majors and minors; C#, F#, Bb, and Eb Major; C#, F#, Bb and Eb Minor
- 17-18: All white and black key majors and minors

After the deadline, I will be setting up the days and times for all students. The collegiate piano will be on FRIDAY. November 3 during the day at Birmingham-Southern College, 900 Arkadelphia Road, Birmingham, Alabama 35254. All other competitions will be on Saturday, November 4 starting at 9:00 AM. If your students have time constraints, I may not be able to accommodate because of the limited number of entrants and the times I have judges available. Please be available the entire day.

MTNA Competitions Registration is Now Available!

The deadline for Composition, Junior, Senior and Young Artist entries is **Wednesday, September 13, 2023, 3:00** P.M. **Eastern Time.**

Due to the anticipated volume of last-minute submissions, MTNA advises you to submit your registration early. Technical support and staff assistance will be available 8:00 A.M.—4:00 P.M. Eastern Time, Monday—Friday. The registration must be COMPLETED by the 3:00 P.M. Eastern Time deadline. Those not completed by that time will not be able to finish their registration form and therefore not be entered into the competition. Teachers are responsible for verifying all repertoire on the registrations of their students.

The following should be available prior to completing the registration:

- PERFORMANCE: Complete repertoire information (title, movement numbers, opus or catalog numbers, tempo markings, complete composer names, historical period and timings).
- COMPOSITION: Computer-generated PDF score and YouTube link.
- Valid credit card number and security code (American Express, MasterCard and Visa only).

Chamber Music entry and video upload deadline is Wednesday, December 6, 2023, 3:00 P.M. Eastern Time. Registration will be available Wednesday, November 1, 2023.


